**Some Tips on Preparing Clippings for Pickup**

Now that spring cleaning time has arrived, the DeKalb Sanitation Department once again is reminding the public of the proper way to prepare yard and tree clippings.

All tree branches and heavy brush that cannot be containerized should be cut in lengths not exceeding four feet in length and stacked in a compact pile on the parkway in front of the residence adjoining the curb—but not into the street.

Sticks, hedge clippings and small brush should be gathered into bundles and tied securely so each bundle does not exceed four feet in length or weigh more than 50 pounds. The sanitation crews will not collect logs and limbs over four inches in diameter or over four feet in length.

Individual home owners may bring limbs and brush to

the disposal sites at Exchange Park, Buford Highway or Camp Road Transfer Station.

**GEORGIA REGULATIONS**

**Bike Safety Rules Listed**

The Georgia General Assembly in its recent session passed into law the "Bicycle Safety Act" which regulates the operation of bicycles on the streets and highways of the State of Georgia.

The newly passed rules are: —Every person riding a bicycle on a roadway or highway is granted all of the rights and are subject to all duties applicable to the driver of a motorized vehicle as provided by Georgia Law.

—Pedals of bicycles must be equipped with a reflector that is visible from the front and rear of the bicycle during darkness.

—All bicycles must have a brake on the rear wheel that will allow the rider to make a braking skid on dry, level and clean pavement.

—Handlebars must not be raised higher than the level of the rider's shoulders in a normal steering grip.

—A bicycle that has been modified or altered in such a way as to cause the pedal in its lowermost position to be more than 12 inches above the ground will not be allowed to use the roads or highways.

—Every bicycle operated during darkness must be equipped with a headlight

emitting white light positioned on the front of the bicycle with a red reflector on the rear. A light emitting red light may be used in addition to the red reflector on the rear.

—Every person riding a bicycle shall ride as near the right side of the road as possible, using special care when passing a standing vehicle or one moving in the same direction.

—Whenever a path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway, bicycle riders must use such a path and shall not use the roadway. This does not specifically refer to sidewalks.

—No person riding a bicycle shall attach the bicycle to any moving vehicle or hold onto any moving vehicle.

—Any person riding a bicycle must ride in a normal

position, not on any other part of a bicycle other than the seat. Nor shall a person ride in a backwards position.

—No one is permitted to allow another person to ride on the handlebars of a bicycle.

—No person riding a bicycle shall carry any package or bundle of objects that prevents the rider from keeping at least one hand on the handlebars.
